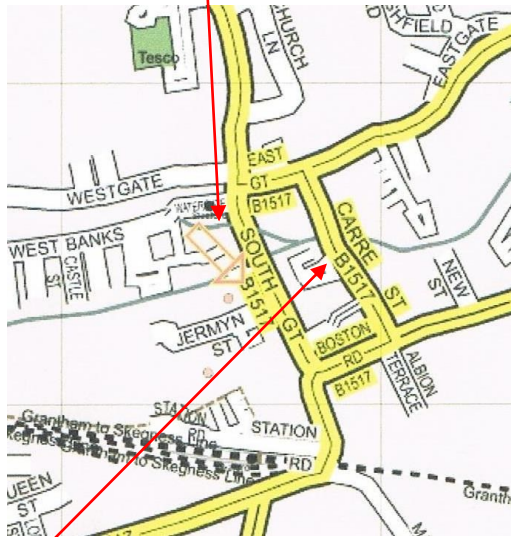

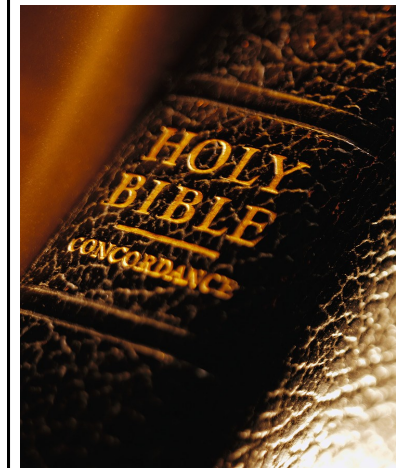

9th October at 7.30 pm Rev John Shearer: John grew up in a mining village in central Scotland and he first heard the gospel in his late teens. His early Christian life was greatly helped by working with Operation Mobilisation. He worked as an evangelist for four years with the Faith Mission and missioned in the Leicestershire area in the 1960s. John married

Jan who was also missioning in the Sleaford area with the Faith Mission in the 1960's. After they married they missioned as a couple in Rutland for a period of time. He then studied theology in Belfast, after which he pastored churches in Northern Ireland and Scotland, as well as being involved in a pioneering gospel ministry in the Republic of Ireland. After 20 years as minister of Musselburgh Baptist Church John retired in 2011 and is now an itinerant preacher.



13th November at 7.30 pm Jonathan Lamb: Jonathan is an author and Bible teacher, and the minister-at-large for Keswick Ministries. He was previously Associate General Secretary of the IFES and Director of Langham Preaching, and he is often teaching and training on behalf of these agencies in different parts of the world. He is the author of several

books, including 'Essentially One: striving for the unity God loves', 'Integrity', and 'Preaching Matters' (all with IVP). He is married to Margaret, and they live in Oxford.

4th December at 7.30 pm Dr Ian Paul: Ian is also the Associate Minister of St Nic's, Nottingham and Managing Editor of Grove Books Ltd, as well as the author of an influential and award-winning blog. He studied Maths at Oxford and Southampton before working in Industrial business (in manufacturing and personnel) and then training for ordination at St John's Nottingham. After



achieving a first class degree in Theology at Nottingham, he completed a PhD on interpreting the metaphorical language in Revelation. Following ten years in parish ministry in Dorset, he returned to Nottingham as Dean of Studies and lecturer in New Testament at St John's, also for ten years. He is now a writer, speaker, editor and academic consultant as well as continuing to minister in local churches.



8th January 2021 at 7.30 pm Rev Hugh Hill: Hugh is the retired pastor of the Thomas Cooper Memorial Baptist Church in Lincoln. As managing Director of his own printing company Hugh had a Damascus Road conversion experience at the age of 42 that transformed his materialistic alcohol fuelled lifestyle. After a number of remarkable years of recognising Jesus as Chairman of his

company Hugh was called to full time ministry and pastored churches in Worthing, London and Lincoln. He is the author of 'I did it His Way', 'Heart of the Bible', and his latest book, 'The Paradoxical Jesus'. He travels throughout the UK helping churches to focus on the spiritual priorities of gospel ministry and mission.



12th February 2021 at 7.30 pm Martin Salter: Martin is the Pastor of Grace Community Church, Bedford where he and his family have been for the last ten years. He is married to Sarah and they have three children between the ages of 8-14. In his spare time he enjoys running.



12th March 2021 at 7.30 pm Rev Dr Philip Wilson: Philip Wilson has been a Chaplain with the Royal Air Force since 2014 and is currently Station Chaplain at RAF College Cranwell, where he is also the Chaplains' Branch Recruitment Officer. He teaches beliefs and ethics to trainee officers, offers pastoral care and preaches regularly on Sundays and at ceremonial events. He

has deployed to the South Atlantic and to the Gulf region in support of UK overseas operations. An ordained minister of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, Philip served in parish ministry for over ten years in Belfast and in Bushmills, Co. Antrim. After a primary degree in Politics and International Relations at the University of Reading, Philip served as Lay Assistant at All Souls Langham Place in London before theological education at the University of Aberdeen Divinity School and Princeton Theological Seminary, New Jersey, where he obtained a Master's Degree in Preaching. Philip returned to Aberdeen to complete a PhD on "Being Single in the Church Today", which was commercially published in the UK and USA. He is married to Hannah and they have a 9 year old daughter.
