O Lord, we beseech you mercifully to hear the prayers of your people who call upon you; and grant that they may both perceive and know

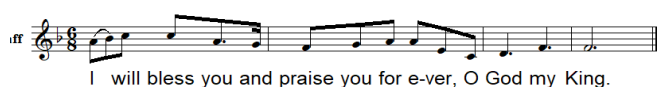
